SPECTRUM

Amardeep Singh Shergill Memorial College, Mukandpur (SBS Nagar) was taken over by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on July 4th, 2007 as a Constituent College with the mission to provide quality education to the rural youth. The University has established this institution as Rural Model College. In the first phase the professional courses like MCA (Three years) and MBA (FYIC) were started during academic session (2008-2009). MBA (two years) was started during session (2010-2011).

The College was established in 1994 in the memory of Amardeep Singh Shergill, an illustrious student of London School of Economics who passed away in prime of his youth. He was the only son of Late Sdrn. Surinder Kaur Shergill and S. Gurcharan Singh Shergill, an NRI from England. Instead of getting subdued in grief, the parents decided to serve noble cause of spreading the light of knowledge amongst rural youth with the help of their NRI associates.

The College is situated in Mukandpur which is a small town in District SBS Nagar. It is about 8 Kms from Banga, 20Kms from Phagwara and 20 Kms from Phillaur. The campus sprawls over 20 acres with an architecture that merges with the landscape. It has a magnificent triple storeyed building with open shelf Library, which has more than 29000 books, 40 journals & magazines and leading newspapers are available. The library has an E-Book section. The students can view the educational CD's in the library. The College library provides facility of Internet and photocopy to students and faculty members. Latest equipments are employed as teaching aids. The College has Chemistry, Botany, Home Science, Child Care, Dairy Farming, Music (V), Physics, Dress Designing, Automobile Maintenance labs and Smart Class Rooms. There is a separate Computer Science and I.T Block, which has six state of art Computer Labs equipped with 150 computers and internet connectivity of 6mbps(1:1) through radio link. Keeping in view the deteriorating standard of English Language amongst rural youth an English language lab with Re-Net software imported from Finland has also been set up inside the College campus. There is a separate Seminar Hall with a sitting capacity of 170 persons. A Hostel for 80 girls is available with extended Internet facility in it.

Gymnasium with its imported machines is a cynosure of all the eyes. Sports facilities include a track of four hundred meter, playfields for Football, Hockey, Volleyball and Handball. Latest induction in the sports facilities is wrestling coaching which is provided free of cost to college students as well as to the non students. A Fleet of eight buses carries the girl students to College and back to their home. The beautiful open-air theatre helps our students to nurture their academic and cultural capabilities. To widen the horizons of the learners, seminars and extension lectures by eminent speakers are arranged in the College from time to time. Separate units of N.C.C, N.S.S, Youth Club and faculty/subject wise societies have been working to make our students disciplined and service oriented citizens. College is leading in academics in the area and also has achieved name and fame in Cultural activities. Educational trips are arranged during the session. Apart from being a medium for entertainment these Educational trips cultivate team spirit, mutual adjustment and tolerance among the youth. Various cultural programmes including talent hunt and Amardeep Mela are organized annually.

Rules & Instructions regarding Admission



- The application for admission will be accepted only in the prescribed admission form, available with prospectus from the college only.
- The form should be filled in by the student himself/herself in legible writing.
- Incomplete form will not be entertained for admission
- The students with compartment in 10+2 can be given provisional admission in B.A /BCA /B. Sc./ B.Com-I but he/she will have to clear the compartment by December otherwise the admission will be cancelled.
- Student who has passed SSC-II from National Open School, New Delhi, with four subjects (including English), minimum two years after matric, can be given admission in B.A./BCA/ B. Sc. (Pass course)/B. Com only on provisional basis. They will have to pass fifth deficient subject in the coming supplementary or annual examination. Failing which the admission will be cancelled.
- Students of B.A/BCA/B. Sc. / B.Com-I who are given golden chance for clearing compartment can not be given admission in B.A/BCA/B. Sc. / B.Com-III in the same year.
- The student with compartment in graduation (B.A./B.C.A/B.Com /B.Sc.- III) can not be admitted in higher courses. If a student clears compartment with in late fee dates then he/she can be admitted with late fee. Result obtained from internet is not valid but if a student produces confidential copy of the result then he/she can be considered. Date of declaration of result will be considered valid not the date of issue of detail marks card.
- The student, whose result is declared late by the Board/University, can get admission within 10 days (from date of declaration of result) without any late fee.
- Failed students from other institutions will not ordinarily be entertained in any course.
- The cases for which there are no prescribed rules by Board/University/Institution, the Principal has full decisive powers.
- College has right to correct the combination if a student chooses or is allowed a wrong subject combination by mistake.
- College has right to change or close any subject/faculty/subject combination.
- The age limit for students of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com-I will be 20 years.
- If the enrolment in any subject in B.A. I reaches 80 the college can deny a particular subject combination / combinations to the students.
- If any student ignores above-mentioned instructions and tries to seek admission by giving fake statement/document, then he/she will himself/herself be responsible for cancellation of his/her admission and forfeiture of his fee/funds.
- If number of admitted students in a class falls short of the minimum requirement set by the university, the admission made to that class shall be cancelled and the fee etc. deposited shall be refunded to the student in due course under university rules.
- The Principal has the discretion to permit or deny admission in any subject/subject combination/option/course in the college to any student

Change of Subject/Course

- A student can change subject/subjects within 15 days from commencement of classes by filling prescribed Performa available in the office.
- Lectures in the subject would be counted from the date the classes started and not from the date of changing the subject.
- A student cannot change subject without informing the office and without the consent of concerned teachers.

Rules & Regulations

Examination

- A student may not be permitted to appear in House Exams/University Exams if he/she fails to deposit fee in time.

House Exams:

- Every student has to be present in all house examinations, absent students will be penalized Rs.100/- per subject/paper subject to maximum of Rs. 300/-.

Eligibility Criteria for University Examination:

- Every student has to get at least 25% marks in aggregate in the house exam.
- A student should have attended at least 75% lectures in every subject.
- If a student does not fulfill the above criteria, he/she will be detained and university roll number will not be issued in any case.



Discipline

- Students must be punctual in attending their classes.
- Roaming about or standing in the corridors during classes is not allowed except when change in class/period takes place. Movement from one classroom to another should be orderly.
- In vacant periods, students should go to the Library, Common Room, Prescribed places for boys and girls or Canteen.
- They must not indulge in loud talk or gossip as it disturbs adjoining classes.
- Writing and sticking bills on the walls of college is prohibited.
- Students are not allowed to do any personal correspondence at the college address.
- No outsider is permitted to meet the students without the permission of Principal.
- Mobile Phones are not permitted in the college premises.
- Any student found guilty of taking intoxicants/drugs in the college campus may be suspended immediately.
- Any damage to the college property will be severely penalized. Such students will not be allowed to continue their studies.
- Students who bring their motorcycle with altered or damaged silencers and produce noise pollution will be fined Rs. 250.
- Students are directed not to go to multipurpose hall and sit or stand on the open air theatre. Any defaulters will be fined Rs. 500 and can be expelled from the college under special circumstances.
- Jeeps/Cars fitted with weapons are strictly prohibited inside the college campus and in front of the college main gate.

Strict disciplinary action will be taken against careless and indisciplined students.

Special Instructions

- Any change in address should be intimated to the office.
- Instructions on the college notice board should be read daily.
- Students must listen carefully to the instructions given during assembly and follow them earnestly.
- No student is allowed to change his/her address to village Mukandpur. The college shall correspond at the original address, filled in admission form.



Points to be noted by the Parents/Guardians

- It is the duty of the parents/guardian to visit the college office in connection with the performance of their wards.
- Contact college immediately whenever informed about any problem.
- Make sure that your ward attends all the classes regularly and takes all the house examinations/class tests.
- It is most essential that your ward secures the minimum marks in house exam and has minimum required lectures in all subjects to enable him/her to take Uni. Exams. Failing this University Roll No. will not be issued.



Rules & Regulations

Taking Leave

- If a student is absent continuously for ten days from a class without sanction of leave, his/her name may be struck off. Re-admission may be allowed only on the request of parents.
- Leave should be applied for by the student personally or by the parents/guardian on the prescribed form available in the office with the required documents.
- A fine of Re. 1/- per lecture will be charged for absence from the class.
- Leave sanctioned by the teacher means only remittance of fine. No relaxation in lectures will be given.
- In case of serious illness the leave application must be submitted as soon as possible along with medical certificate. Even then there can be no relaxation in the university condition of minimum lectures.

Transport

- Routes of Buses can be changed from time to time.
- Routes for the students will be decided by the college and they should obey the directions.

Library & Identity Card

- Library remains open throughout the session except on Sundays and other holidays.
- Student should deposit their personal belongings at the entrance before getting into the library.
- Students will not take cuttings from library books, newspapers or magazines.
- Books will be issued for days mentioned in due date slip or for 14 days. Fine of Rs. 1 per day will be charged per day for overdue books.
- A student, who loses, defaces or otherwise damages any book shall have to pay the cost of the book as per library rules.
- Books should be carefully checked before getting issued.
- Number of books which can be borrowed at a time from library is :

Undergraduate classes:	Three books
Post Graduate classes:	Six books
- Library tickets should not be lent/borrowed/misplaced and are to be submitted in the library at the end of session for clearance of account. If the tickets are lost the student will be responsible for the misuse of the tickets and will have to pay for the books if those are issued on the lost tickets.
- Loss of ticket should be reported to the Librarian. A fine of Rs.10 per ticket will be charged for the loss of ticket. Perfect order and silence are expected in the library and reading hall.
- Each student will be issued an identity card at the commencement of the session. It will be necessary for every student to get the Identity card issued in prescribed time period. The students are required to be in possession of their identity cards while in College and produce the same if asked for.
- The loss of identity card should be reported immediately and a police FIR is to be done in that case.
- Fine of Rs.50/- will be charged in case of loss of Identity Card. It is the responsibility of the student to get duplicate card issued immediately.
- Reference books and magazines will not be issued to the students.
- At the end of the academic year every student must obtain a “No Due Certificate” from the librarian to enable him / her to sit in the examination and claim back the library security

Financial Assistance

Fee Rules

- It will be the responsibility of the student/parents to deposit the fees in time, irrespective of the fact that it is notified on the Notice Board or not.
- Late fee fine Rs. 20 per day will be charged if dues are not cleared in time.
- Students seeking late admission will not have any concession in late fee.
- Fees once deposited will be refunded under University rules only.
- If a student leaves the college in the middle of the session he/she is required to inform the college office. Failing this he/she will have to deposit all dues along with fines in order to claim any certificate from the college.
- Half tuition fee will be charged from the junior most of two or more brothers/sisters studying in the GNDU campuses/Constituent Colleges.
- Students who leave the college can get the refund of their security by 30th November in the following session, subject to the condition that all their dues are cleared. If not claimed in time, security will be lapsed. Students will have to produce original receipt of their fee of entry year in the college to claim the security.
- As per Punjab Government scheme of “Post Metric Scholarship to Scheduled Castes students (Centrally Sponsored)” the objective of the scheme is to provide financial assistance to students studying at post matriculation or post secondary stage to enable them to complete their education. The scheme is implemented by the State Government which receives 100% central assistance from GOI for the total expenditure under the scheme, over and above the committed liability of the State. Scholarship will be paid to the students whose parents/ guardians income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2, 50,000/- (Rs. Two Lac and Fifty Thousand only) per annum. The value of scholarship includes the following for complete duration of the course:
 1. Maintenance allowance
 2. Reimbursement of compulsory non refundable fees
 3. Study tour charges
 4. Thesis typing/printing charges for research scholars
 5. Book allowance for students pursuing correspondence courses
 6. Book bank facility for specified courses
 7. Additional allowance for students with disability for the complete duration of the course as per the provision of the scheme.

The College will implement the scheme of the State Government to ensure that compulsory non refundable fees as per provision in the scheme is not to be charged from the eligible SC students/candidates. However, an income declaration by the self-employed parents/guardian, stating definite income from all sources by way of an affidavit on judicial stamp paper is required. Employed parents/guardians are required to obtain income certificate from their employer and for any additional income from other sources, they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.
